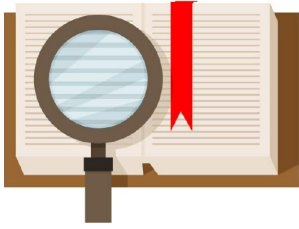

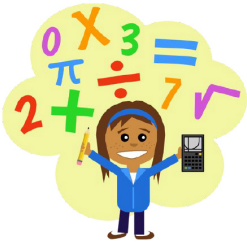


Figure it Out!

How long did the Great Depression last? Show your work with a math problem.



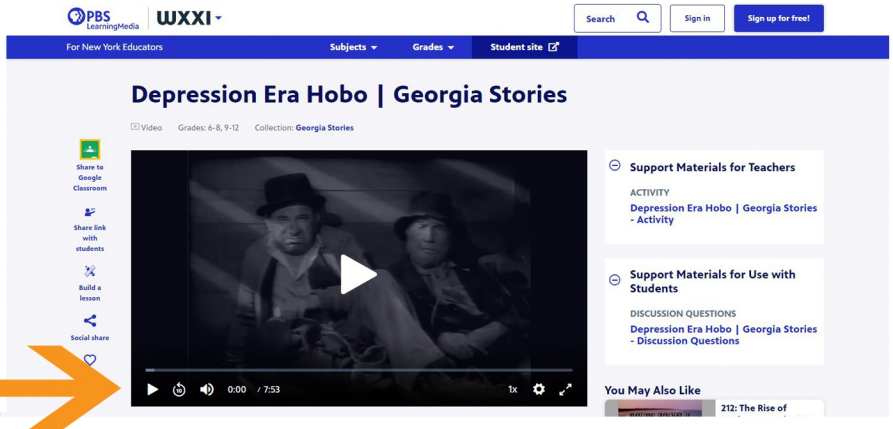
Research it!
